

Three statements, one file

The four sheets below are three statements, not one. Nothing drawn on them says where one recipient ends and the next begins — the file says it, beside the pages rather than on them, so a press can print and cut this run without a second file explaining it.

Baker and Sons

Each part claims its own run of sheets, states the customer it is for and the number of copies owed, and carries the data file that belongs to it and to no other part. A reader shows one document; a press reads three.

Terms of payment

Payment falls due thirty days from the date this statement was posted. An amount still owing after that date carries interest at three times the legal rate, and a fixed sum of forty euros towards the cost of recovering it. Payment is made to the account named on the statement, quoting the customer number.
